Saint Paul gives some biographical information as he testifies to the validity of his doctrine. He mentions several post-resurrection appearances of Jesus-- including some not otherwise mentioned in the Gospels. He ends with a recollection of his own vision of the Risen Lord. Because Jesus had ascended into heaven some time before, Paul felt that his experience made him like a child born after the normal time. Paul had encountered Jesus while traveling to Damascus, Syria. His mission had been to arrest and execute Christians. Suddenly a bright light and powerful voice literally struck Paul. This experience would heavily influence Paul's teachings, especially that of the spiritual link between Jesus and all of his followers.
